Program Description: The Associate of Arts for Transfer in Elementary Teacher Education Degree is designed to provide students a seamless transfer to the California State University system. The transfer degree is designed to prepare students for a baccalaureate degree in Liberal Arts or Liberal Science and continuing to earn a multiple subject teaching credential.
